Tidings Tips: Water Heater Wisdom

This month's feature customers, Anna and Norberto Benitez, were wise to wrap their hot water heaters. This simple step can save 4–9% in water-heating costs for an electric storage-tank heater. Save even more like this:

- Set the water heater thermostat at 120°, never more than 130°. How hot is your water now? The Library at Energy Depot (www.beachesenergy.com) gives full instructions for measuring the water temperature and adjusting the thermostat.
- Storage-tank electric heaters keep water hot 24/7. Are
 you out most of the day? Buy a timer to turn the heater off
 and on to suit your schedule.
- If you leave home for two days, turn off the water heater at the circuit breaker.
- Insulate the pipe coming out of and into the water heater.
