ENERGY MYTH #5: Set your air-conditioner fan to ON at the thermostat to save money and increase comfort.

Think again. In the ON position, the fan runs continuously—even when the system is not cooling (or heating). Constant running uses more electricity. It can also add humidity to your home, costing even more. In Florida's climate, the AUTO setting is recommended to lower energy consumption and maintain comfort within your home. The fan will turn on only when the system produces conditioned air. Some newer systems even come with a variable speed fan for better efficiency. Ask a professional for advice.





Tidings Tips: Use the Breezes.

Instead of running your air conditioner fan 24/7 (see cover), think about moving air in a less costly way.

- A ceiling fan makes skin feel cooler and allows you to set the thermostat higher. Remember: Turn off fans when you leave a room.
- Take advantage of May's mild, dry days. When possible, open windows and sliding doors for breezes. Fans will help pull in cooler outside air.
- Dry some laundry on a line or rack. You'll save clothesdryer energy, with a bonus of less heat in the house.
