Tidings Tips: Condition Your Air **Conditioning System**

The approaching spring and summer's heat makes it a great time to review your HVAC maintenance checklist:

- Trim bushes and shrubs around your outdoor units to allow at least two feet of clearance.
- Remove leaves and debris from inside the top grille of the outside unit.
- Replace your air conditioner filter.
- Rinse the coils on your outside unit.

Now is a good time to have your HVAC service professional do a spring check-up. In typical Florida homes, about 20 percent of the air that moves through the duct system is lost due to leaks, holes and poorly connected ducts. There are several things you can do to improve duct performance in your home. First, start by sealing leaks using foil tape (UL181) and mastic sealant. In addition, make sure that the connections at vents and registers are well sealed where they meet the floors, walls and ceiling.

This involved evaluating the quality and thickness of the foam insulation that was applied by our insulation contractor.
