Tidings Tips: Keeping Your Holidays Safe

The holiday season is busy and full of many distractions and departures from your routine. These tips should help you to stay alert to possible safety hazards and enjoy a safe and happy holiday this year.

- Avoid injuries by using proper step stools or ladders when installing decorations outside or on your tree.
- Most residential fires happen during the winter months. Never leave fireplaces, stoves or candles unattended.
- Keep a smoke detector and a carbon monoxide detector in your home and test them once a month, replacing the batteries twice
- Use only UL listed holiday lights, and carefully inspect them for fraying, bare spots, gaps in the insulation, broken or cracked sockets or excessive kinking or wear before decorating with them.
- Don't link more than three light strands unless directions indicate it is safe. Connect strings of lights to an extension cord before plugging the cord into the outlet. Periodically check the wires, as they should never be warm to the touch. Never leave unattended lights on.
- LED lights allow you to plug more lights together with little or no heat.
- Use only nonflammable decorations, and never block exits with tree or holiday decorative installations.
- Avoid using lit candles. Consider using battery-operated flameless candles which can look, smell and feel like real candles.

Thermostat Settings in Winter

Florida's mild temperatures rarely dip below freezing, but when they do, here are some tips to help your thermostat maintain indoor temperatures and keep energy bills lower.

- Thermostats should not be located near windows or kitchens. Do not put any heat source, such as lamps, near a thermostat.
- "Set it and forget it". We recommend 68 degrees during winter months. When raising the setting on a heat pump, remember only to change the setting in 2 degree increments to avoid engaging the heat strips.
- At bedtime, reduce your setting down by 2-3 degrees.
- When going out of town for the weekend or extended periods of time, lower the setting to 55 degrees during winter months.
- Lowering the setting from 68 to 65 degrees while you sleep reduces the run time of your heating unit up to 15 percent.

Conservation Minded Holiday Gift Ideas

Do the people on your holiday gift list have enough neckties, fruitcake and nutcrackers? Here are some gift ideas that keep conservation in mind and allow recipients to appreciate the thought as well.

- Crank it up! Dynamo/crank and solar powered radio, USB charger and flashlights are available from \$20 - \$60.
- LED flashlights and light strings add festive ambient lighting year round, and use only a fraction of the energy of standard lighting.
- Go reusable! Convert to using reusable shopping and tote bags, and refillable water bottles made of stainless steel or BPA free plastic.
- Shop locally from merchants in your community, especially by purchasing items made or grown locally, saving the fuel spent on shipping items long distances.
- Give a charitable gift in honor of someone instead of purchasing more things.
