1. Never Use a Generator Inside

Portable generators emit carbon monoxide (CO), a deadly gas that can build up in your home when used inside or in an attached garage.

2. Buy a Carbon Monoxide Detector

Another great way to reduce your CO risk is by using a carbon monoxide detector. If CO levels get too high, an alarm will sound allowing you to act fast.

3. Don't Plug a Generator into Your Home's Wiring

Connecting a generator to your home's wiring or outlets creates a serious electrocution risk for your home, your neighbors and utility workers.

4. Practice Fire Safety

Never store fuel indoors, never try to refuel a generator while it's running and never overload the generator by running more appliances and equipment than it can handle.
