SPRING INTO DIY PROJECTS SAFELY

With warmer weather around the corner, it's the perfect time for outdoor DIY projects. However, safety first!

STEPS FOR SAFE DIGGING:

- 1. Notify: Before you begin, call 811 or make an online request two to three days before you start.
- 2. Wait: Give utilities a few days to mark buried lines.
- 3. **Confirm:** Ensure all utilities have responded to your request. Follow the guidelines provided by your 811 call center or the information on your ticket.
- 4. Respect: Heed the utility marks! If your project duration exceeds the expiration of the marks, contact 811 for a re-mark.
- 5. Dig Carefully: DO NOT dig close to or within 18-24 inches of marked lines. If necessary, consider relocating your project.
